Spring/Summer Group Updates

Pink Group: Well Spring certainly provided us with ideal conditions in the gardens, plenty of sun and the occasional shower meant that our crops of lettuce, tomatoes, radishes, corn, beetroot and cucumbers provided us with large harvests each week. As the weather has warmed up we have planted heat tolerant veggies including purple climbing beans, chillies and have planted up one bed with ginger for harvest next year. We decided to experiment with a raised pot for zucchini growing, (in collaboration with the orange team). It is hoped that this will help ward off the powdery mildew that plagues these veggies in the humid weather.



Albie the choko is doing us proud having once again reached the apex of the trellis although there is no sign of any fruit yet. And lastly we have planted peanuts as a heat tolerant crop for the summer, these grow well in temperatures between 22-30 deg C. These will take about four months to reach maturity and so should be harvested in the coming autumn.

Purple Group: Our spring crop of corn was great and we had no rat attacks! We have planted various chillies and they all love the hot weather and there will be a bumper harvest soon. The eggplants in the two raised beds are looking lush and hopefully they'll produce a lot of eggplants as well.

We also contributed to the huge cucumber harvest with six plants in the wicking bed and just replanted some more because we know how much our president loves them;-)



Taking turns watering the beds during the week in the hot conditions is a bit of a challenge as we "lost" some group members who returned to Vic & NZ over the summer and we can't wait to welcome them back in autumn/winter!

Green Group: Asparagus plants are running away to the leaf stage before we get to harvest the stems. Like other teams, the green team is currently battling bugs and heat to produce a nice crop of beetroot, Florence onions, buttercrunch lettuce, perennial spinach and rocket. Unfortunately, the last of our delicious silverbeet and leeks will be harvested this week, and at present, there are no indications for further harvests from our artichokes and tomatoes. Sorry Doug, more cucumber seed plantings on the way this week.

The Orange Team feel ATTACKED!

- Turkey attack the first passionfruit plants -Solution - nets and bricks
- Bird (possible cockatoo) attack the unripe citrus
 Solution nets
- Stink beetles and their offspring attack the citrus plants - Solution - hand removal of adults, White Oil application, removal of infested branches
- Another type of stink beetle and moth attack -Borlotti beans - Solution - spray and prune impacted foliage



Borlotti beans have been harvested and shelled and are drying out.

- Beetroot and carrot are developing in their underground haven.
- Pak choi and Wombok have been planted, with nets creating a barrier to the white moth. Even so, the heat may cause these brassicas to bolt!
- Purple climbing beans are taking off at the passion fruit trellis.
- A few summer squash have been harvested. To help mother nature, we are hand pollinating the squash and watermelon.

Gotta love gardening in the subtropics!



Recipe of the Month

Who says you can't win friends with salad, put this one on your xmas table and your guests will come back for more.

Layered Garden Salad

Ingredients

- ½ iceberg lettuce, chopped roughly
- 250g (2 cups) frozen peas, thawed
- 2 Lebanese cucumbers, finely sliced
- 6 hard boiled eggs, grated
- 250g mushrooms, sliced
- 125g tasty cheese, grated
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 4 tablespoons sour cream
- · 1 tablespoon french mustard
- 4 spring onions, sliced
- 1 large tomato or 12 cherry tomatoes
- 2 rashers of bacon, diced, cooked crispy and drained on paper towel
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley



Instructions

- This recipe is best made in a large, clear glass bowl so the layers are visible,
- Layer 1 Place the chopped lettuce at the base of the bowl and scatter the peas over the lettuce,
- Layer 2 Place the sliced cucumbers in a visible ring around the side of the bowl, any remaining slices can be placed on top of the lettuce and peas,
- Layer 3 Add the sliced mushrooms,
- Layer 4 Add the grated egg,
- Layer 5 Add the grated cheese,
- Layer 6 Combine the mayonnaise, sour cream and mustard, mix well and spread in an even layer on top of the cheese,
- Layer 7 Decorate the salad with the cooled crispy bacon pieces, halved cherry tomatoes or tomato wedges and chopped parsley,
- This salad is best assembled on the day of serving, but many elements can be prepared the day before. (For a vegetarian version, leave out the bacon).



As we look back over the past twelve months, once again we have achieved much in the garden this year. Every year it goes from strength to strength and I am sure our longest associated members will agree that it has come a long way since this time in 2021 when it was decided that the gardens would be moved to this current site.
